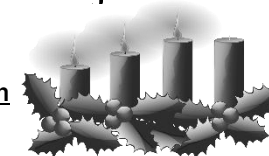

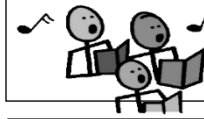

Third Sunday of Advent

From Fr. Charles's desk

Theme: What shall we do in order to welcome Christ in our hearts?

The Liturgy of today's mass, the third Sunday in Advent, urges us to rejoice. St Paul gives us the reasons why we should rejoice. His basic reason for our profound happiness is that our Lord is near. 'Near' means that he is with us here and now, present in our midst, and closer to us than the person sitting next to us. He is close by grace. That grace comes in many ways: through liturgy, sacraments, through Christian community, through the special presence of his spirit. So, we rejoice!

In eight days' time, we shall be re-living the experience of the greatest wonder ever of our God becoming man like us in everything but sin.

The third Sunday of Advent is traditionally called 'Gaudete Sunday' from the Latin for 'Sunday to rejoice.' It marks the midpoint of Advent when the vestments become a little lighter and the rose candle or pink candle on the Advent wreath is lit.

In today's gospel reading, John the Baptist shows us the way to the profound joy that is at the spiritual heart of this season. In the reading, at the beginning of Jesus' ministry, John was proclaiming Jesus as the Messiah. This led to the crowds asking, as we all must ask in facing Jesus "What should we do". John tells the crowd to share what they have with others, the opposite of selfishness and greed. Tax collectors come to him and he tells them not to extort money from people. Soldiers come and he tells them not to abuse their power. In other words, we clear the messiah a path not with bulldozers, singing, decorating but by repentance.

More so, we can make John's message our own. How do we prepare for the coming of the Messiah? With repentance, however, Jesus Christ becomes and remains an important part of our life. There are many ways of clearing a way for the Lord. For us Catholics, one way is very specific and concrete. That way is the sacrament of Penance with its honest self-examination, confession, and intention to change our life, absolution and God-grace. Repentance is the door to a magnificent Christmas. St. Francis de Sale once wrote that real repentance is strong, settled constant and tranquil not turbulent and occasional.

Let us pray

As we continue in our Advent observance and reflection, let us take heart from John's assurance that God is always ready to forgive us. Let us pray for the humility to acknowledge our sinfulness, the courage to repent and the resolve to do better. Amen.
