2015 Catholic Service and Ministry Appeal – DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

As of June 30, the CSMA has received pledges amounting to \$948,036 from 5,359 households, for an average gift of \$177. They are at 80% of the overall goal of \$1,181,400. Last year they were at only 75% of their goal at this time, with 5,127 households pledging their support.
